





Objectives

- a. Reduce negative effects on human health from flooding.
- b. Reduce negative impacts to vulnerable populations from flooding.
- c. Reduce flood damage to buildings and infrastructure.
- d. Reduce economic disruptions and losses from flooding.
- e. Reduce negative effects to natural and cultural resources from flooding.

Prioritize Gaps to Address



Gap Identification Process

Gap: A practice that is not effectively being implemented across and/or within Virginia state agencies which in turn limits the Commonwealth's ability to successfully execute flood resilience strategies statewide.

Synthesis of input into draft Prioritization Gaps



Priority Gaps to be Addressed

Access to up-to-date and comprehensive data resources that support long-term flood resilience planning and resource allocation decisions

Community knowledge and capacity to take proactive steps to reduce vulnerability to flooding

Coordination among state agencies to streamline flood resilience strategies and reduce redundancies

Funding resources for asset maintenance

Funding resources for long term resilience planning that support a wide breadth of needs at both the state and local government level

Reliance on non-permanent federal funding posing challenges in sustaining flood resilience programs

Robust decision-making frameworks and capacities to facilitate long-term planning efforts and resource allocation decisions

Staff capacity and data management resources for coordination between federal, state, and local agencies during events to ensure targeted event response

Staff capacity and funding resources for additional grant application and management support to local governments

Staff capacity and resources for interdepartmental data aggregation and coordination for comprehensive flood risk assessments, including those for state-owned assets

Staff capacity and resources to coordinate technical assistance for funding and program initiatives to address long-term flood resilience goals

Staff capacity for integration of flood resilience tools

Staff capacity hindering collaboration, technical assistance provision, and funding outreach efforts

Staff capacity to address and assist with federal and state regulations
