Overview

- Number of Students Impacted: 480 6th-grade students from Brookland Middle School, Fairfield Middle School, and Henrico Virtual Academy
- Number of Educators Impacted: 10 educators trained in MWEE and outdoor education

Summary

This project engaged 480 6th-grade students from Brookland Middle School, Fairfield Middle School, and Henrico Virtual Academy in a Meaningful Watershed Educational Experience (MWEE). Students participated in paddling excursions on the James River and explored the unique habitat of Great Shiplock Park. These experiences deepened their understanding of watersheds, ecosystems, and the interconnectedness of human and natural systems. Educators received training to incorporate MWEEs and outdoor learning into their classrooms, ensuring the program's long-term success.

Highlights and Feedback

A standout moment came when students, many paddling for the first time, expressed awe at seeing wildlife such as bald eagles and hearing about the history of the James River. Teachers shared that the hands-on nature of the activities made abstract concepts tangible for students, significantly enhancing engagement and understanding. One teacher noted, "This was the first time many of my students truly connected science to the real world—they left inspired to protect their environment."

Details of Activities and Outcomes


Summary of Activities

Students participated in immersive learning activities, including:

1. Canoe Paddle

a. Students engaged with the river by working together to paddle canoes. Before paddling, they received a safety briefing, were fitted for appropriate-sized life jackets, and received basic paddle instruction. Once loaded onto the canoes, students practiced navigating on the water. Students spent time with an educator observing the James River. After discussing concepts like sediment pollution and

erosion, the group tested the turbidity of the water using Secchi disks. Observations and readings were tied back to the overall state of the James River today.



2. Nature Exploration Walk

a. At this station, students joined a group and were assigned a scientific role to play in observing the different environments around the river. Student roles included meteorologist, zoologist, botanist, geologist, and cartographer. Outside, the group visited 2-3 locations around the River Center and the James. The students were given time to record observations on a worksheet at each location. At the end of the hike, students shared their observations and compared each location.

Educator Training

Ten educators participated in MWEE-focused professional development, gaining skills to create interdisciplinary, outdoor-based learning opportunities.

Impact and Feedback

This MWEE gave students a memorable, hands-on experience that connected them to their local watershed. Students learned about ecosystem health and watershed dynamics while building a sense of stewardship for the James River and the Chesapeake Bay. The program also empowered teachers to sustain outdoor and environmental education in their classrooms, expanding its long-term impact.
