Recreational Trails Program Overview

The Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is an assistance program of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) established for the purposes of developing and maintaining both nonmotorized and motorized recreational trails and trail-related facilities. RTP funds come from the Federal Highway Trust fund and represent a portion of motor fuel excise taxes collected from nonhighway recreational fuel use.

Permissible uses of RTP funding include: maintenance and restoration of existing recreational trails, construction of trailside and trailhead facilities, purchase or lease of trail construction and maintenance equipment, construction of new recreational trails, acquisition of trail corridors, assessment of trail conditions, and development of trail safety and environmental education materials.

The RTP legislation mandates that funding be specifically divided among three categories: 30% for motorized trail uses, 30% for non-motorized trail uses, and 40% for multi-use/ diversified trail uses. Projects on both land and water trails are permissible.

The program reimburses up to 80% of eligible project costs up the award amount. Recipients are responsible for contributing a matching share of at least 20% of project costs.

The FHWA annually allocates RTP funds to each state and provides oversight to state agencies who administer the program. The agency responsible for administering the program in Virginia is the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR).

RTP in Virginia

Virginia's RTP program is administered by DCR's Division of Planning and Recreation Resources (DCR-PRR).

As mandated by RTP legislation, an advisory committee representing nonmotorized and motorized trail users advises DCR-PRR on funding priorities, award amounts, and evaluation of project proposals.

Entities eligible to receive funding include town, city, and county governments, tribes, non-profit organizations, recreation agencies and regional recreation authorities, and state and federal agencies.

Projects are selected for funding through an annual competitive grant round, typically held each spring. Each summer DCR-PRR works with the selected project sponsors to obtain FHWA grant authorization. Awards are typically announced in September. Recipients have three years to complete their projects.

From 1993-2025, Virginia has received over \$36 million in RTP funding and awarded over 375 individual grants.

RTP Administration in Virginia

FHWA awards RTP funding to DCR-PRR, who sub-awards the funds to the project sponsors through grant sub-agreements which outline the scope of work, maximum funding, deliverables, and other requirements for each project.

DCR-PRR serves a liaison between FHWA and grant recipients throughout the grant process. DCR-PRR also provides technical assistance to grant recipients and applicants, advises recipients in compliance with grant regulations, processes grant payments and reports, and develops application materials and guidance documents.

FHWA allows up to 7% of the RTP apportionment to be used for program administration. Each year, DCR-PRR allocates 7% of the annual apportionment for the next year's administration. Unused administrative funds are transferred to open projects at the end of the next federal fiscal year.

Financial Status

In FY25, \$1,238,432.28 in RTP funds were received from FHWA and reimbursed to project sponsors. The full FY25 apportionment of \$1,511,889.00 was obligated to new projects. Grant funding of \$1,034,932.85 from projects that were completed under budget or withdrawn was reobligated to new projects. As of FY25 end, remaining grant fund balances on open projects totaled \$7,509,103.26.

In FY25, \$42,253.64 in administrative grant funding was reimbursed to DCR-PRR, an additional \$1,189.21 was utilized for costs associated with the Recreational Trails Program Advisory Committee, and \$66,027.68 was or will be returned to open grant projects. DCR-PRR has reserved the allowable 7% of the FY25 apportionment, \$105,832.23, for FY26 program administration.

Open Grants

As of FY25 end, there are 43 open RTP grants with awards totaling \$9,269.017.62.

Grants 321M090, 330M190, 342M220, 350D230, 354N230, 355N230, and 364A240 have reached completion but are pending receipt of final reports, final reimbursement processing, and/or administrative closeout with FHWA.

Grant 332M210 was withdrawn by the recipient due to issues in securing right of way access.

Based on committee recommendation, \$676,230.76 in unspent funds on grants 321M090, 330M190, and 332M210 were transferred to the new equipment purchase grants awarded to Southwest Regional Recreation Authority.

Two separate new grants, 369M250 and 378M250, were awarded to Southwest Regional Recreation Authority for their equipment purchase proposal due to equipment location, size of awards, and timing of administrative procedures for transferring funding from their previous grants.




2025 Grant Round

Applications were accepted for the 2025 grant round from March 11 – May 6, 2025. The grant round was announced via press release and direct email to DCR-PRR recreation grants contact list. Application materials were available for download from the DCR RTP website. An informational webinar and applicant workshop was held on March 25. In total, \$1,798,344.72 RTP funding was available split among the three categories: diversified: \$636,993.08 available; non-motorized: \$469,417.40 available; and motorized: \$691,994.24 available.

Application Review

Twenty-four applications were received and scored by the seven-person RTP Advisory Committee representing trail users from across the state and one DCR-PRR representative. Application ranking was based on an average of the eight scores.



2025 RTP Applicants and Proposed Project Locations

Committee Recommendations

In the motorized category, the committee recommended to fund three applications for work on motorized water trails at their full requests: New River Conservancy, New River Valley Regional Commission, and Botetourt County. The committee recommended to award the remaining motorized category funds to Southwest Regional Recreation Authority (SRRA) to purchase equipment for maintaining their motorized trail system. The committee also recommended SRRA be offered the opportunity to transfer unused funds from three open grants awarded in previous years towards their equipment purchase proposal.



In the diversified category, the committee recommended funding the top four projects at their full requests: Town of Clifton Forge, Gloucester County, City of Hampton, and Historic Germanna and transferring \$26,078.20 in funding to non-motorized category applicants for projects that support diversified trail users.

In the non-motorized single use category, the committee recommended funding the top four projects at their full requests: Shenandoah National Park Trust, Town of Narrows, White House Farm Foundation, and Virginia Department of Forestry, utilizing additional funding transferred from diversified category for the Town of Narrows' project that includes elements supporting diversified trail users. The remaining balance of \$10,545.60 was reserved for unanticipated environmental review costs on open projects.

Grant Awards

DCR moved forward with funding amounts in accordance with the committee's recommendations. The new grants were authorized by FHWA in August and subgrant agreements executed in September. In the motorized category, in addition to \$321,769.24 in FY25 grant round funding, SRRA elected to transfer \$676,230.76 in unused funding from three open grants towards new equipment purchase grants. In the non-motorized category, the remaining balance of \$10,545.60 was added to previously awarded grant 360D240 which had incurred unexpected archaeological review costs.



Unawarded Applicants

Applicants not selected for funding were notified in late July and invited to meet with the DCR-PRR grant coordinator to review their applications and obtain feedback for future application submissions. Six of the 12 unawarded applicants elected to participate in this process.

Each year applicants that previously participated in this process are successful in obtaining funding. Three of the 2025 awarded applicants had gone through the feedback process in 2024.

FY26 Preview

Projects Nearing Completion

A number of projects are expected to be completed and administratively closed out in early FY25, including:

- 2015 Charlottesville Meadow Creek Trail Bridge
- 2019 Southwest Regional Recreation Authority Wayfinding Grant
- 2019 Southwest Regional Recreation Authority Equipment Lease
- 2022 George Washington and Jefferson National Forests Lee Ranger District OHV Maintenance Project
- 2023 Conservation Legacy d.b.a. Appalachian Conservation Corps Shenandoah Mountain Trails Maintenance
- 2023 Friends of the Rappahannock Rapidan River Water Trail Public Access Rehabilitation
- 2023 Natural Heritage Big Cedar Creek Trail Landslide Repair

An additional eleven projects have project end dates in late FY25.

Advisory Committee

DCR-PRR aims to maintain an advisory committee roster of five to seven members. Currently at seven members, when members elect to leave the committee, replacement priority will first consider adequate representation by motorized and non-motorized trail users as required by program legislation, followed by any gaps in areas of trail expertise and geographic dispersion from across the commonwealth.

Past Project Records


Originally planned for FY25 but delayed, DCR-PRR will continue to update our data on past RTP-funded projects with the goal of mapping all 370-plus Virginia RTP projects. When complete, this information will be accessible via the RTP page of the DCR website.

2026 Grant Round

Both new trail construction and maintenance and amenity projects on existing trails will be eligible in 2026 and future even-year grant rounds. DCR-PRR will continue to hold odd-year grant rounds for maintenance and amenity project applications only. DCR-PRR aims to open the grant in mid-March, with applications due in mid-May. The advanced notice of funding from FHWA indicated funding levels should be the same as in 2025, subject to federal release. It is likely some funds will be rolled over from projects that complete under budget and no major eligibility or scoring changes are anticipated.
